**Russell G. Mawby Fellowships in Philanthropic Studies
Dorothy A. Johnson Center for Philanthropy
Request for Proposals and Application**

Application deadline: **April 15, 2022**

Award to be announced: **April 29, 2022**

Russell G. Mawby's generous endowed gift to the Dorothy A. Johnson Center for Philanthropy has allowed the center to establish the Russell G. Mawby Fellowships in Philanthropic Studies. This ongoing fellowship program honors Dr. Mawby's lifelong devotion to nurturing, mentoring, and opening doors of opportunity for youth worldwide, as well as his quarter century of leadership in the world of philanthropy as the CEO of the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, which ranks among the world's largest private foundations. Dr. Mawby passed away in 2017.

The Johnson Center is now issuing a Request for Proposals for the 2022-2023 Mawby Fellowships in Philanthropic Studies. The fellowships are of two types. The first type is a Faculty Fellowship, which is a stipend of \$5,000 paid in two installments: \$2,500 upon notification of this award, and \$2,500 upon completion of the project. This award is open to all members of the GVSU faculty, including teaching Administrative/Professionals and Affiliates. The second type is an Undergraduate Fellowship, with two awarded per year at a stipend of \$1,000 each for two fellows: paid as hourly students through student employment.

The topic for the Mawby Fellowships will be suggested by the person chosen to be the Mawby Faculty Fellow, with the advice and consent of the Mawby Fellow Selection Committee. The topic must focus on the intersection between any field of academic study and the theory and/or practice of philanthropy. For example, previous Mawby Fellowship projects focused on: "Philanthropy and the Presidency," "Philanthropy and Business Serving the Bottom of the Pyramid," and "Marketing Strategy for Nonprofit Organizations."

The Faculty Fellow will be expected to bring knowledge from their primary area of study to bear upon the topic, along with insights gleaned from other disciplines, including philanthropy and/or nonprofit management. The Faculty Fellow must propose a topic of original research that is of interest and value to practitioners in the field of philanthropy.

This proposal must be approved by the Dean of the college in which the faculty member has their appointment. The Faculty Fellow will be chosen by the Mawby Fellow Selection Committee, consisting of the Johnson Center's executive director, the dean of the Center for Scholarly and Creative Excellence, and a third person appointed by them.



The two Mawby Undergraduate Fellows will then be selected by the Faculty Fellow after the Faculty Fellow is notified of the award. The Faculty Fellow will enter into a working and mentoring relationship with the Mawby Undergraduate Fellows, in which the Undergraduate Fellows will serve as research assistants and also co-authors of any published research.

As a result of this research, the Mawby Faculty and Undergraduate Fellows will be required to produce an original, tangible product, such as a research paper, a creative work, or a thoughtful essay, which will advance the understanding of the philanthropic and/or nonprofit sector. All such products must be co-authored by all three Fellows, and should be submitted for publication and/or presentation in an appropriate venue.

Finally, there will be an expectation that the Faculty Fellow and the Undergraduate Fellows will remain connected with the Johnson Center as part of a network of friends and supporters across lines of schools and departments at GVSU. This networking will continue after the formal Fellowships end.

The individual stipend of \$5,000 for the Faculty Fellow will be paid (typically as an overload contract) in two installments: \$2,500 to be paid upon notification of award; \$2,500 paid upon the completion of the project. Undergraduate Fellows will be paid for actual hours worked at an agreed upon rate up to a total of \$2,000 per year (\$1,000 each for two Fellows). The Fellowship commences in August of 2021 at the beginning of the fall semester.

The Fellowship is expected to last one year, although in some exceptional cases it may be extended over two years. The individual stipend of \$5,000 for the Faculty Fellow will cover all costs, including those for meetings, supplies and general project travel. Up to an additional \$1,500 is available if needed to support travel to present findings at an appropriate professional conference.

To apply:

Submit the following documents:

1. A detailed proposal (two to four pages) on a topic of original research that focuses on the intersection between any field of academic study and the theory and/or practice of philanthropy. The proposal should include details of a proposed tangible product, a plan for the publication of research findings, and a detailed budget.
2. Written approval of your proposal from the dean of the college to whom you report.
3. Curriculum vitae and/or resume with your name, address, phone, and an email address.
